Age groups to be addressed

- Small children and their parents
- Youngsters
- Young adults
- Adults in working age
- Elderly persons
- Old and frail persons

- Challenges
 - Enough time for care
 - Care facilities
 - Sufficient maintenance (money)
 - High divorce rate
 - Lone parents

- Achievements
 - Enough time for care
 - Parental leave (also for fathers)
 - Problem: most fathers take only the minimum period
 - Problem: cash benefits do not replace salary

- Achievements
 - Care facilities
 - Legal entitlement to a care facility
 - Problem: not enough crèches
 - **Problem:** care facility must not be offered in the neighbourhood

- Achievements
 - Sufficient maintenance (money)
 - High divorce rate
 - Lone parents
 - Legal claims for maintenance were extended
 - Advancement of payment by public institutions
 - **Problem:** maintenance payments insufficient because of unemployment
 - Problem: only limited support by public institutions

Youngsters

- Challenges
 - need for high level education
 - care after school
 - regular meals

Youngsters

- Achievements
 - need for high level education
 - Cost-free education
 - Coverage of transportation to school
 - Problem: many extra-costs for books, equipment
 - care in / after school
 - regular meals
 - More all-inclusive schools
 - Problem: not free of charge

Young adults

- Challenges
 - -Professional education
 - -Vocational training
 - -Unemployment rate

Young adults

- Achievements
 - -Professional education
 - -Vocational training
 - At the moment, good chances to get professional education or vocational training
 - **Problem:** many young adults are not fit for the labour market

Young adults

- Achievements
 - -Unemployment rate
 - Compared to Southern Europe lower because of practice-related professional formation and better economic data
 - **Problem:** Precarious employment
 - **Problem:** More young adults live with their parents
 - Problem: Many young adults refrain from building up a family

- Challenges
 - Unemployment rate
 - Low salaries
 - Unhealthy working conditions
 - Instable partnerships (divorce)

- Achievements
 - Unemployment rate
 - Lower than in Southern Europe
 - **Problem:** precarious jobs; part-time jobs; work contracts often limited in time, even for years
 - Problem: reduction of benefits; obligation to accept any job

- Achievements
 - Low salaries
 - Implementation of minimum wages
 - **Problem:** Minimum wages not sufficient for families; no adequate retirement pension

- Achievements
 - Unhealthy working conditions
 - Better rehabilitation programs
 - **Problem:** stricter rules to get an invalidity pension; obligation to accept all kinds of work
 - Problem: reduction of invalidity pensions
 - Instable partnerships (divorce)

- Achievements
 - Instable partnerships (divorce)
 - Participation of both partners in accrued old age benefits (sharing of pension entitlements)
 - **Problem:** complex procedure, risk of two poor partners in old age
 - Obligation of both ex-spouses to maintain themselves after divorce
 - Problem: divorced women often work-part time or find only low paid jobs

Elderly persons

- Challenges
 - Incapability to continue (full) work life
 - Adequate retirement pensions

Elderly persons

- Achievements
 - Incapability to continue (full) work life
 - Employers are obliged to provide an adequate job
 - **Problem:** employers often persuade elderly workers to leave the enterprise
 - Problem: Persons above 50 hardly find a new job

Elderly persons

- Achievements
 - Adequate retirement pensions
 - Old age pensions higher than in southern European countries
 - **Problem:** In future, lower pensions due to modified calculation formula, raising retirement age and low wages during activity
 - **Problem:** danger of increasing poverty rates for elderly persons

Old and frail persons

- Challenges
 - Sufficient financial resources
 - Adequate long term care

Old and frail persons

- Achievements
 - Sufficient financial resources
 - Minimum pensions
 - **Problem:** means and asset-tested; not always indexed to inflation rate
 - Adequate long term care
 - Improvement of benefits
 - Problem: only part of (high) costs is covered
 - **Problem:** not enough staff, residences and nurseries not sufficiently controlled and supervised

Conclusions

- No consistent social policies
- Programmes for targeting specific groups
- Winners: parents with small children
- Neutral: old and frail persons
 - In future: probably elderly and old persons will get more benefits because increasing group for elections
- Losers: Adults in working age
